

Program of Events	 The Canadian Lifeguard Challenge is 3 consecutive Oceanwoman/Oceanman rounds. Round 1 is a traditional Oceanwoman/Oceanman course. The order of legs is ski – board – swim. Round 2 is an M-shaped Oceanwoman/Oceanman course. The order of legs is swim – ski – board. Round 3 is a traditional Oceanwoman/Oceanman course. The order of legs is board – swim – ski. The time between each round is predetermined. See detailed schedule for times. 	
	Males and females compete on the same course. The male and female Oceanman/Oceanwoman rounds shall be run consecutively. See schedule.	
Eligibility to apply to Participate	 To be eligible to apply to compete in the Lifeguarddepot.com Canadian Lifeguard Challenge, competitors shall: Hold a current (within 24 months of the date of certification) Lifesaving Society Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross or National Lifeguard certification (any option) by August 6th, 2023. 	
	 Be a registered athlete with the Lifesaving Society Canada. Finish in the top 16 places of the Open Division Oceanwoman/Oceanman event at the 2022 Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championship (CSLC), or Finish in the top 3 places of the Youth Division (15 – 18 years) Oceanwoman/Oceanman event at the 2022 Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championship (CSLC), or 	









	 Participated as Canada's National Team Entry for Oceanwoman, Oceanman at the 2022 World Lifesaving Championships in either Youth or National Team events, or Top 5 placing at the 2019 Canadian Lifeguard Challenge, or National Team Coach – Pierre Tabah Nomination All applicants will receive confirmation of their application. Applying does not guarantee selection. Following a review of all applicants by the selection Committee (event director & meet manager), Eligible athletes who have been selected will receive an invitation to compete in the Canadian Lifeguard Challenge to be held on August 6, 2023. Decisions by selection committee regarding invitation are final. A Maximum of 18 Women and 18 Men will be selected to complete. 				
Starting Position	For each round, starting position shall be determined by random draw. Starting positions shall be consecutively numbered from the left (facing the water) starting with the number 1. Competitors must commence craft legs from the correct allotted beach positions. The starting positions are reversed for the board and surf ski legs. For example, in a 16-competitor race in which a competitor has drawn position 1: the competitor commences the initial craft leg from position 1 but commences the other craft leg from position 16. Scoring	Competitors shall be allocated the following points in each round. Final rankings shall be determined by the total points accumulated from each of the 3 rounds. 1 st place 20 points 9 th place 8 points 2 nd place 18 points 10 th place 7 points 3 rd place 16 points 11 th place 6 points 4 th place 14 points 12 th place 5 points 5 th place 13 points 13 th place 4 points 6 place 12 points 14 th place 3 points 7 th place 11 points 15 th place 2 points 7 th place 11 points 15 th place 2 points 7 th place 10 points 16 th place 1 point Ties in overall point score shall be broken using the following system: 1				








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	 Wetsuits must be worn in water temperatures 13°C or less. Chief Referee may permit wet suits at any time due to conditions. 	
Equipment and Handlers	Athletes must provide their own craft. (Board, Ski and Paddle)Craft must meet ILS specifications.Competitors must have an equipment handler who is knowledgeable in the event rulesand their role as an equipment handler.Equipment handlers must wear a Lifesaving Ocean Competition Cap matching that oftheir athlete. (Please bring 3-4 caps each – One cap will go to the announcer and willbe returned at the end.)Handlers will not wear a vest.Athletes are required to have their craft ready in the designated position prior to thestart of the race. The start of each round shall not be delayed if athlete's equipment isnot available or not in position. Each round shall start at the predetermined,designated time.Equipment handlers can be provided if checked off on the registration form. It will bethe responsibility of the athlete to coordinate with their handler assigned.


