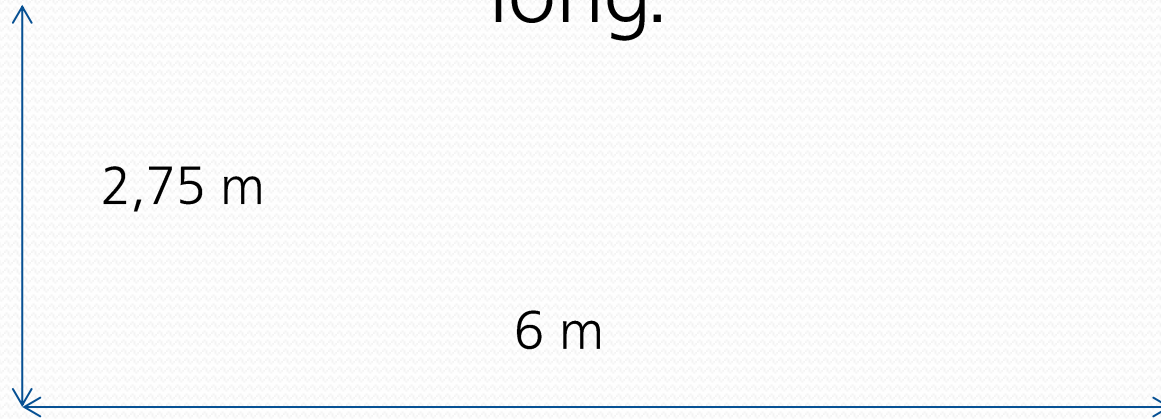

REQUIRED DEPTH FOR A SAFE DIVE

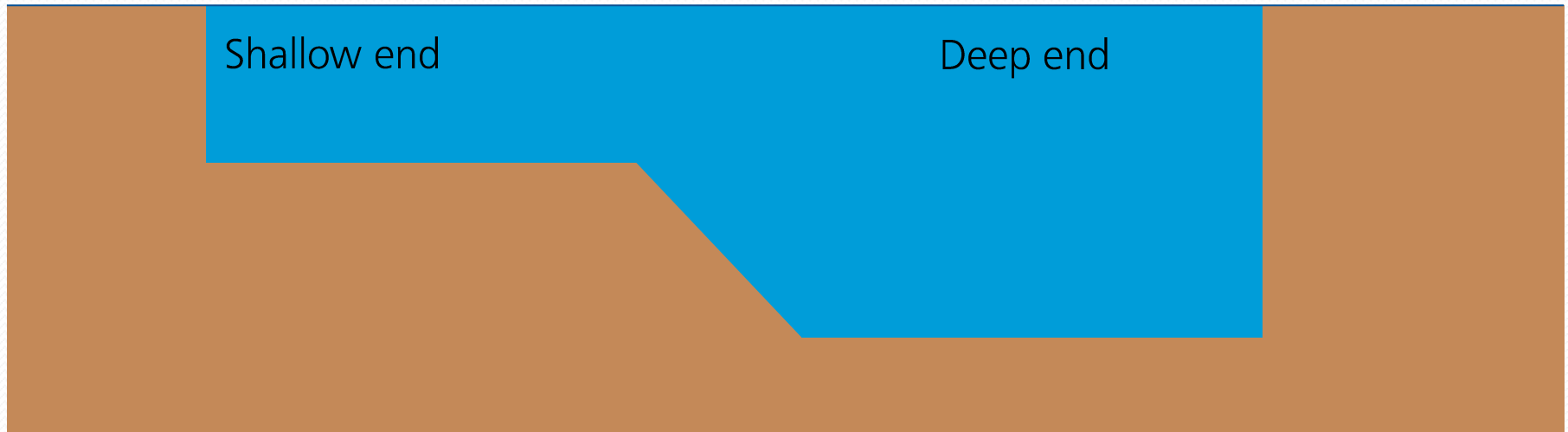




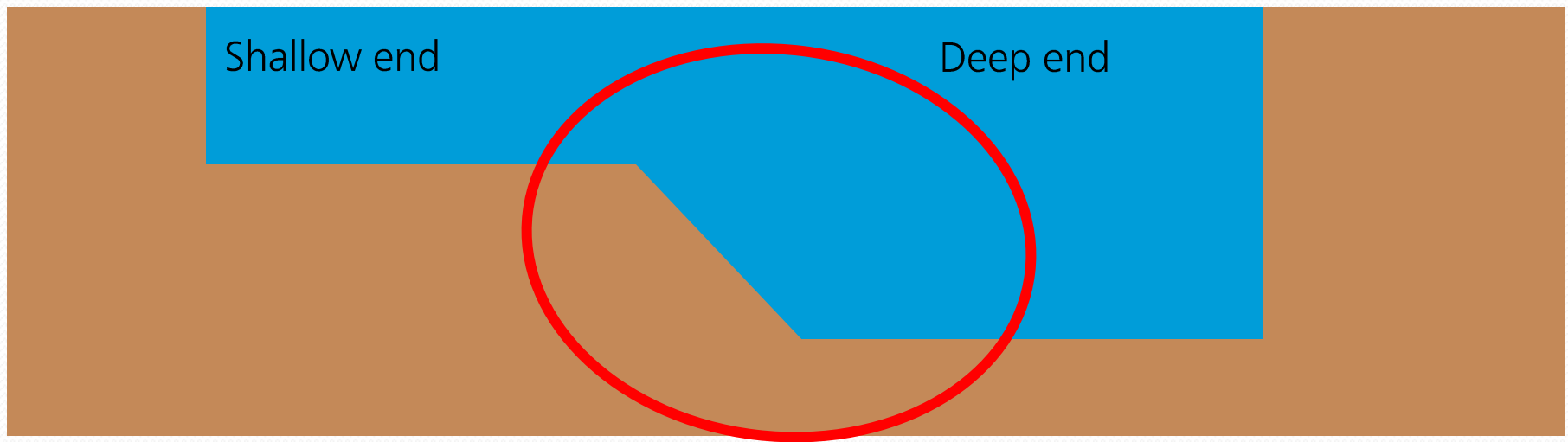
To safely dive from the poolside, the place from where you dive must be at least 2.75 m deep and 6 m long.

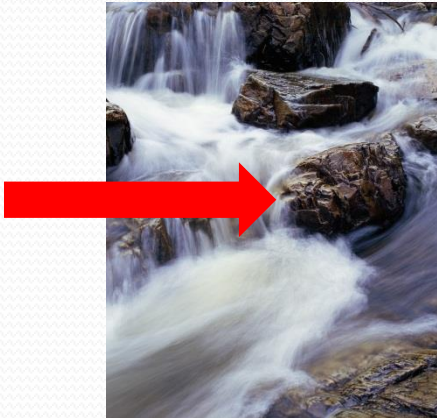


IS IT SAFE TO DIVE IN A NATURAL ENVIRONMENT?

- 1- Check depth: 2.75 m
- 2- Check length: 6 m
- 3- Ensure there are no obstacles:

IN SHORT

IS IT SAFE TO DIVE IN:

An above-ground pool? **No!**

A public pool? In deep end only
(springboards)

A natural environment? **Always check
beforehand!**
