PRESCHOOL 1-5


SWIMMER 1-6


(5 to 12 years old) leading to Junior Lifeguard levels

Created in 2002, the program was rolled out in Quebec in 2022 following the withdrawal of the Red Cross as a swim course provider.

In fact, the implementation of the **SWIM FOR LIFE** program, which is a continuation of lifesaving training, significantly reduces the dropout rate of swimmers after Level 6 while giving them a taste of lifesaving skills.
