EVALUATION GRID FOR MANAGEMENT

Airway obstruction: conscious adults, children and infants (GCSU Item 12)

Approach to the situation

Assessment of the environment for hazards

Assess level of obstruction : ask "Are you choking?"

Rescuer identifies themselves - asks "Can I help you?"

Partial Obstruction

Encourage the victim to cough

Reassure the victim

Complete Obstruction Adult/Child

Call for help

Choose the appropriate technique: abdominal thrusts or thoracic thrusts (pregnant or obese)

Position yourself appropriately

If the method does not work, choose another method

If the maneuvers are successful, advise the victim to consult a doctor to rule out possible complications following the obstruction or treatment

Complete Obstruction Infant

Call for help

Appropriate positioning

Alternate 5 back blows and 5 chest compressions until airway is clear or victim becomes unconscious

If the maneuvers are successful, perform a primary examination and advise the person responsible for the baby to consult a doctor to rule out the possible complications from the obstruction or treatment

Candidate is able to recognize signs/symptoms and treat them.

Candidate adequately simulates a 9-1-1 call.

Candidate ensures their own safety for the duration of the intervention.

Candidate respects the objectives of emergency care (preserve, prevent and promote).
