* The *Success pending validation* result indicates that a candidate has successfully completed a training and needs to complete a required placement to obtain the National Lifeguard Instructor award or the Trainer award. The candidate has 12 months to complete the placement.

** For a group transfer (Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross, or National Lifeguard), it is important that only the evaluated items during the exam have pending results. The other items must have been evaluated beforehand by the instructor. The transfer must be completed three months following the training. It is important to note it in the exam file.

***The Development plan is a tool for all instructors and trainers of la Société de sauvetage. In the eventuality that at the end of a training the candidate does not master the entirety of the performance criterion, the Development Plan will outline the tasks needed to receive a result. The attributed result is "Pending result". It is important to specify the reason in the exam file's comments.

The steps outlined in the Development plan must be completed within three months or less. Here are a few examples:

- Working on elaborating lesson plans, long-term plans, and other documents.
- Completing a placement or co-teaching with an experienced instructor.
- Getting mentored by a Lifesaving Society mentor.

Once the Development Plan completed, the candidate's file will be revised to issue a result.

If there are too many tasks outlined in the Development plan or if they are too complex within the three months timeframe, the instructor needs to fail the candidate. The person will then have to retake the training. If someone is in a failure situation, it would be best to orient the Development plan's objectives as to better prepare the candidate for retaking the course.

Special situations:

- If the candidate does not show up at the training, they should not be found on the exam sheet.
- If a candidate is added by mistake, please mark their result down as "unavailable" and add a comment so that we may remove them from the exam.
